The un-charted waters that we have had to travel amid the various challenges faced by students having to adapt to a new way of learning and changes to their normal routines; staff having to move quickly without an option but to up-skill in on-line and remote learning; whānau who have had no alternative to managing home schooling as well as whānau who managed remote learning while also working from home, are nothing but admirable. We thank everyone for going the extra mile and remaining resilient in the face of adversity.

Our recent experience of COVID-19 and its effects has given us an opportunity to reflect on what sits in an order of priority and everything points back to people. People as a child and student; people as a whānau; people as colleagues; people and their thoughts coupled with feelings is a very important aspect of relationships that needs to be nurtured in every word we speak, in every move we make and in every thought that passes. We are very lucky in our kaupapa that we have the guidelines of Te Aho Matua to provide focus and attention in keeping the walls of our whare strong.

Students are encouraged to return to Kura:

We acknowledge, at COVID-19 alert level 2, that people across the nation are still very anxious about exposure outside of their safe havens. We would like to strongly encourage the return of all our students to Kura.

The end of an era:

I would like to take the opportunity to inform you all that our nanny Nancy has decided to move into retirement. Nanny Nancy has been a focal member of our Kura staff having worked closely with both staff and students for 18 years. She started working at our Kura in June 2002 as a pouāwhina. Nanny Nancy was a consistent tutor of the porowhā language programme. Her presence will be missed on a daily basis but we hope to receive frequent visits from nanny Nancy for a cup of tea when she can.

A celebration and acknowledgement of Nanny Nancys time as a valued staff member within our Kura will be organised and we will advise whānau of the details when they are confirmed.

Interim reports:

We have made a decision to waver our normal Mid Term Reports and produce an Interim Report that will provide a general update on how your child has progressed with Te Reo Matatini, Pāngarau and during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Drop off and Pick up of students:

Staff have been very pleased with the support of our Kura Whānau while dropping off and picking up your tamariki. Whānau have respected our safety plans and have made this part of our day very smooth. *Kei runga noa atu koutou!*

New Break Times & No Bell:

As a part of our efforts to maintain safe distancing and consider the space our tamariki play in, we decided to amend our break times and silence our bell. Both Kura Teina and Kura Pakeke now follow varied break and eating times. This has been a very positive and effective change. We have noticed a more peaceful interaction between students, Te Reo Māori is more evident, the students transition into their break times easily and naturally return to class without the bell. Our only hope is that as more students return to Kura we are able to maintain this positive change.

Extension of numbers at Level 2:

From the announcement of government to extend gatherings to 100 people, we are now confident to safely return to our huihuinga ā-Kura gatherings in due time.

Opening our Kura doors to Visitors:

As of Wednesday 27 May 2020 Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Manawatū moved to opening our doors to visitors. Visitors to the school may include tradespeople, service people or educational support agencies on school-related business .ie: observing or working with students and/or staff. We have a set of guidelines to offer visitors on how we will continue to maintain safety during their visit.

Kura will be closed this coming Monday 1st June as we acknowledge Queen's Birthday weekend. We will see you all back at Kura on Tuesday the 2nd June.

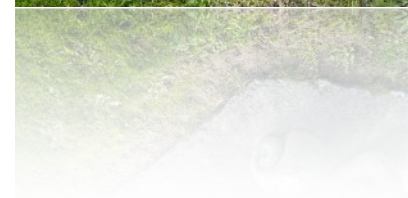
