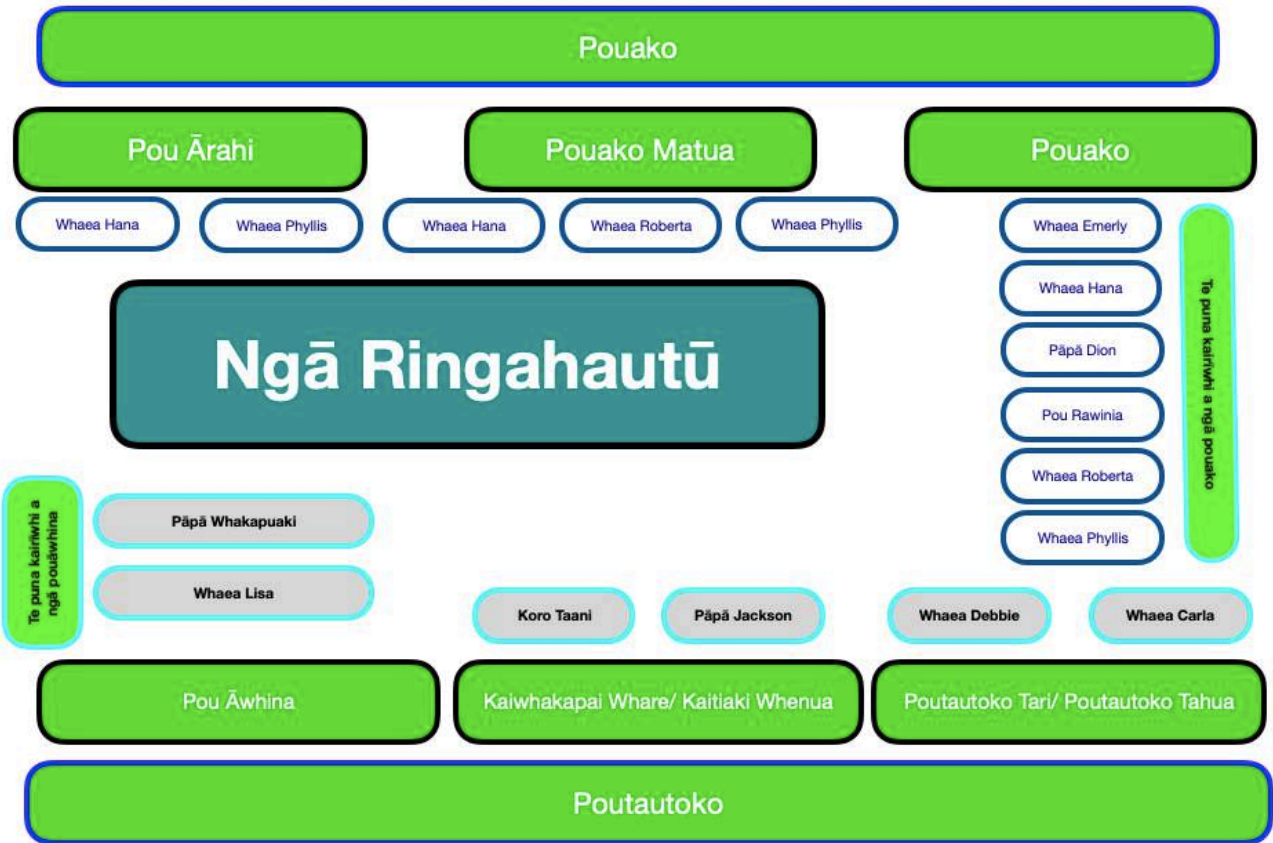
## **Nanny Nancy's Mihi Poroaki:**

**Ngā Kaimahi:**

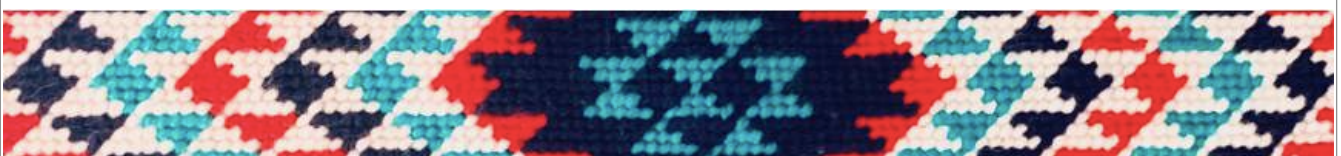

**Early Arrivals:**

With construction commencing at Kura, now is a perfect time to remind our Whānau of **Drop off** and **Pick up** times. **Students should not be arriving at Kura before 8:30am.** We need whānau to support staff by not dropping your tamariki off to Kura early. Before 8:30am staff are preparing for the day and are not rostered on duty to supervise students. The correct drop off and pick up times are...

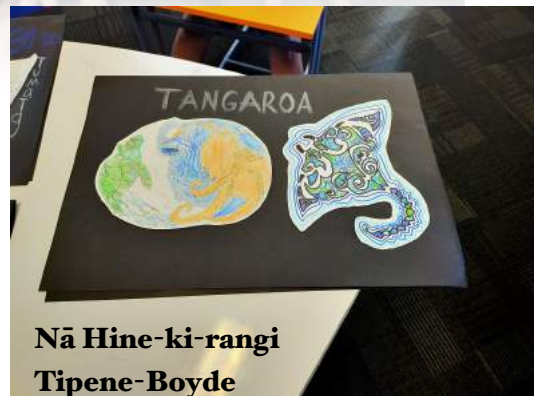

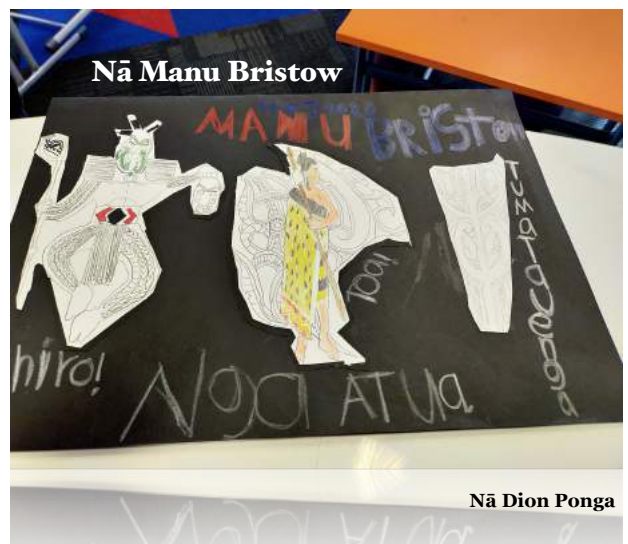
