Tēnā koutou e ngā mātua,

Next Tuesday the 10th of November, the kura will be attending the 'Kō Whiri Tika Mai' regional kapa haka competition being held at the Regent Theatre on Broadway. Our senior kapa haka team will be the 5th team to perform on stage at 11:30am.

The whole kura will be attending to support our senior group's performance.

We will depart kura by bus at 9:15 am to allow time to settle in our seats and watch a couple of groups before our team performs.

Students are to be dressed in their kura day uniforms for this outing. A cut lunch, morning tea and drink is to be provided. The cost to this event will be covered by Kura.

Following our senior team's performance:

Kurahaupō, Puketōtara akomanga and Rangiotū (non-performers) will return to kura at 12:00 pm for the remainder of the school day.

Aotea and Arawaru (non-performers) will remain at the Regent Theatre to support the remainder of the competition and will need to be uplifted from the front of the Regent theatre at 3:00 pm.
