PAE TAMARIKI 2021

As you are all aware our annual kapa haka festival for Papaiōea (Pae Tamariki) commences next week. Kura is fortunate to host this hui once again. What Does Your Tamaiti Need To Bring:

Girls may also wear heru Māori and earrings (bone or pounamu). Boys need to wear **BLACK** underwear, NOT shorts, NOT boxers, NOT bicycle pants.
