KUA HOKI ORA MAI Ā TĀTAU TAMARIKI ME NGĀ KAIMAHI

All akomanga are settling in. Tamariki are getting used to their pouako for 2022. Everyone is trying hard to get used to the masks which has proven challenging for some. Mātua mā, if your tamaiti has a medical condition that exempts them from wearing a mask eg: asthma, respiratory condition, vision or hearing impairment, the Disabled Peoples Assembly are no longer issuing exemption cards to children.
